LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN



We continue to go through hard economic times, disrupting the socio-economic fabric for very many people. With an extremely high country dependence ratio of above 60 % of a population exceeding 41 million, and a young population of more than 80% below 30 years of age, Uganda is more exposed to face increased child-abandonment, specifically because of the high trend of inability for many to support babies. Sanyu Babies' Home (SBH) will face greater (increased) volumes of orphans to protect, investigate, and administer fostering/adoption services for the less privileged abandoned babies. First, we need more support to meet these increasing recurrent costs of the Home. Secondly, SBH has been bracing itself for the expected high future orphan inflows by stressing the need for the proposed **extension project**, shown in this Newsletter. We have now embarked on more preliminary steps to ensure that the expansion programme resolve is pursued to a conclusive end.

We pray that in HIS mercy, GOD prevails on you to offer assistance to SBH for this very deserving cause. Also pray for us. May GOD bless you and reward you.

They reported the matter to Matuga Police Station that forwarded the case to Kasangati Police Station and there after referred the baby to Sanyu Babies' Home for care and protection as the investigations are carried on.

Coming to Sanyu Babies' Home I didn't know what to expect. All I knew was what others have told me, that it is a place filled with love. I had rarely arrived to such a warm welcome when travelling. From the first moment on, you get the feeling of warmth, happiness, love and gratefulness for being here. The guest house of Sanyu's giving you a homelike feeling. Being here for only about 3 weeks already gave me an insight on the incredible work that is being done here every day.

From the moment I walked in everybody greeted me with open arms. The Mama's (who take care of all these children), were happy to have a helping hand, but even more the children's eyes just light up when they see someone new enter the site. They literally greet you with open arms, not caring who you are or where you are from, beyond happiness that there are more people to give them the love and attention they deserve. The way they enjoy the body warmth that you give them and the look they give you when they lean their head against you is pure and beyond appreciation. It is a feeling that I can hardly describe. Giving someone so little of a gesture but getting such a meaningful response is simply incredible. They are a family that plays, helps and like any family occasionally fights with each other. They are such smart, beautiful and bright children. Seeing how quick they adapt and learn from you and each other is amazing. They are far more independent than other children their age, making them even more precious.



I envy the Mama's for the love, strength and patience they have for these children day after day. To be honest, I don't know if I would have the strength to look after so many children and take care of them every single day. They have three day and three night shifts every week, whilst some of them have children and grandchildren to look after and provide for at home as well, besides some of them being single mothers. That is a level of dedication a lot of us could learn from. Surely as volunteers it can be quite overwhelming and exhausting at times, considering we are not used to the routine, but then we get to take breaks and relax whenever we feel it is too much for us. The Mama's don't. They push through it and turn up with a smile on their faces the next day. Some of the greatest moments I already experienced here, were seeing some of the children being adopted and the new found love their parents had for them, including the celebration on that day and the joy in everyone's eyes. Being able to work with everyone at Sanyu's has already taught me a lot. It might sound a little cliché, but sometimes a warm hug is worth so much more than we think and further we can do so much more than that. We just have to remind ourselves that some people need the help and love more than others.

Feature: The Farm Project



Some 40 kilometers from Kampala on Mityana road, Sanyu Babies' Home has access to 25 acres of prime farm land. Situated on the village of Kitete, this land is covered with a banana plantation, sweet potatoes, maize, cassava, beans and vegetables. We also have some pigs on the farm. We are happy to inform you that last year, we had a good harvest of maize crop from our property. With this crop we were able to produce

maize (corn) flour for making porridge for the babies, as well as posho (maize meal) for the staff. We are thankful to GOD for the good harvest HE provided to us, and pray HE continues to bring rain for our current harvest.
